The Featherstone School Sports Partnership would like to highlight the outstanding work that has been achieved by working in partnership over the 2015-16 academic year. This report has been written by your PE Mentor and gives you an overview of what has been offered in conjunction to the service level agreement, and the take up of your school.

PE Mentor Support*

Your School – 34 hours

The first half of the year had been focused on planning, setting up assessment and writing policies. As a result, the school have produced new medium and long term plans, baseline assessment data, PE policy and a PE development plan.

Time had also been spent selecting and training a Yr 6 organising crew to assist in the running of Yr 2 & 3 Change 4 Life club to start after the Easter break, along with other roles including sports day.

For the second half of the year your PE Mentor worked with the reception teacher modelling lessons and team teaching building the knowledge and confidence of the staff member. Your mentor also showed staff how to write lesson plans for PE, understand and use PE resources and equipment for the REAL PE programme and differentiate in PE. Some progress was made but more is required to get the ultimate aim of being good in PE.

Your Teachers have also received programmes from the FA skills and London Welsh Rugby Team. Children have developed confidence and social skills and teachers developed lesson ideas.

Training this year has been developed to offer more staff the opportunity to develop their skills and knowledge in PE and the delivery of the REAL PE program. It is vital all staff are supported to deliver high quality lessons. Your PE Coordinator attended a course run by Create Development on KS1&2 REAL PE, completed a full day first aid course. Members of staff also attended the Active Literacy CPD led by the YST, which will be given as a whole school inset by PE coordinator/ Mentor.

Allenby has supported staff through the delivery of bespoke whole school CPD session focussed on embedding the Active Literacy Programme although further development by staff is necessary. Feedback from CPDs has been positive and teachers feel they now know how to use resources and they just need to find the time to continue to do so.

Change 4 Life Champions Training was completed by ten Yr 6 pupils, hosted at Featherstone High School. Children developed leadership skills and now help to promote healthy active lifestyles throughout the school and run a Change 4 Life club for Yr 2&3. Further training was then given by your PE Mentor/ Coordinator to develop your organising crew and young ambassadors. Children are now more confident and enjoy leading and helping in sports events.

Youth Sports Trust Review

The school has completed their self-review this year and has achieved a Bronze Award which is a great success. The self-review focuses on the school's provision of physical education and school sport, against set outcomes. Please make sure this is displayed on your school website as it is recognised by Ofsted as showing the schools engagement in developing physical education and school sport.

In looking towards a Silver award it is vital the spend and vision of the Sports Premium is shared with all school staff. This will ensure they are all invested in placing a high value on the impact PE and school sport will make for the children.

School + SSP Development Plan

The development plan uses chosen development areas from the Youth Sport Trust Self review.

A main focus for the first half of the year was to develop and introduce a baseline assessment system for YRs 1-6 and develop a tracking system to monitor assessment for PE. Your PE Mentor/Coordinator has carried out baseline assessments and has a working document for FUNS assessment that has been carried out through the school half termly and is set against national averages.

We have also introduced a highly informative PE board into the school environment with a completely new intuitive of PE stars running throughout the school to help with raising the profile of PE and to focus on the positive behaviours shown in school sport.

Moving forward Yrs 4, 5 & 6 were targeted to receive the opportunity for some outside coaching in football, delivered as part of the FA Skills Program and Tag Rugby offered by London Welsh Rugby. The impact of this targeted coaching has been to engage more pupils in curriculum lessons develop teacher's skill and confidence and ultimately lead to an increase in attendance at sporting clubs and events.

This year the school has continue to focus on working towards the school games and Youth Sports Trust Bronze Awards and this will be monitored via our development plan.

School Games

The School Games is a national programme delivered to all schools by your School Games Organiser, who is a member of the Featherstone School Sports Partnership. It aims to develop competitive opportunities, leadership training and inclusive PE ideas including the inclusive health check and Change for Life.

During the year the school has completed its inclusive health check, logged and planned and completed their School Sports day and has a good understanding of all of the resources staff within the school can access.

The school have applied for their School games award during our awards day on the 8th of July 2016, with the aim of achieving a targeted award of Bronze.

Change 4 Life

Allenby this year have ran a Change 4 Life club for YRs 2&3, this has been led by the YRs 6 Sports Leaders and Ambassadors. The children have also completed the Change 4 Life Champions Training. Children are more promotive of healthy active lifestyles and have grown in confidence throughout the programme.

Strengths

The school has supported and trusted the PE Specialist to embed school sport with the support of the FSSP throughout the school. The PE Specialist has continued to raise standard in PE throughout the school day and has bought in external coaches to increase participation, improve social skill and physical skill level. The school were recognised for their work linking PE and healthy schools and received one of the Featherstone School Sport Partnerships Innovation Awards.

A growing understanding of Active Literacy is being used within SEN classes and it would be good to see it developed throughout the school with the support of the PE mentors and CPD being attending by other teachers.

Looking forward to next year

The PE Mentor/ Coordinator will support the training of reception, Nursery and KS1 teachers in REAL PE and Gymnastics.

PE Mentor/ Coordinator will continue to make links with external clubs with the help of FSSP.

PE Mentor/ Coordinator will continue to set up clubs for key students using the change for life plan.

We Hope to see the school engage fully with the competition offer. It will help achieve silver in your School Games Award.

It is recommended that other teaching staff attend any additional training run by the SSP in 2016-2017 academic to ensure high quality teaching of PE is achieved and maintained across the whole school.

The school will also receive an inset from the SSP specifically targeted key stage staff.

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
